Question: What MLB team has the most World Series Championships?

Level 3: The New York Yankees have the most World Series Championships, with 27. Their most recent win was in 2009, when they defeated the Philadelphia Phillies. In 1921, the Yankees appeared in their first World Series with Babe Ruth as an outfielder.

Question: What MLB team has the most World Series Championships?

Level 4: The New York Yankees have dominated World Series Championships, with 27, having appeared in 40 World Series Championships games. The team with the next highest number of championships is the St. Louis Cardinals, but they only have 11 World Series Championships. The Yankees were considered be a dynasty in baseball, playing in 15 out of 18 World Series between 1947 and 1964, and winning 10 of those championships. The Yankees are the only team to have won more than 3 World Series Championships in a row, winning 4 between 1936 and 1939 and winning 5 between 1949 and 1953.

All research **MUST** be cited. Any research that you come to school with **MUST** have a source accompanying it.

Anytime that you are using a source to answer a question (a website, a book, a magazine, an encyclopedia, an interview), you need to give credit to that source. Otherwise, you are pretending that it is your thoughts and ideas. This is called **PLAGIARISM**.

Plagiarism is stealing someone's word and lying about it.

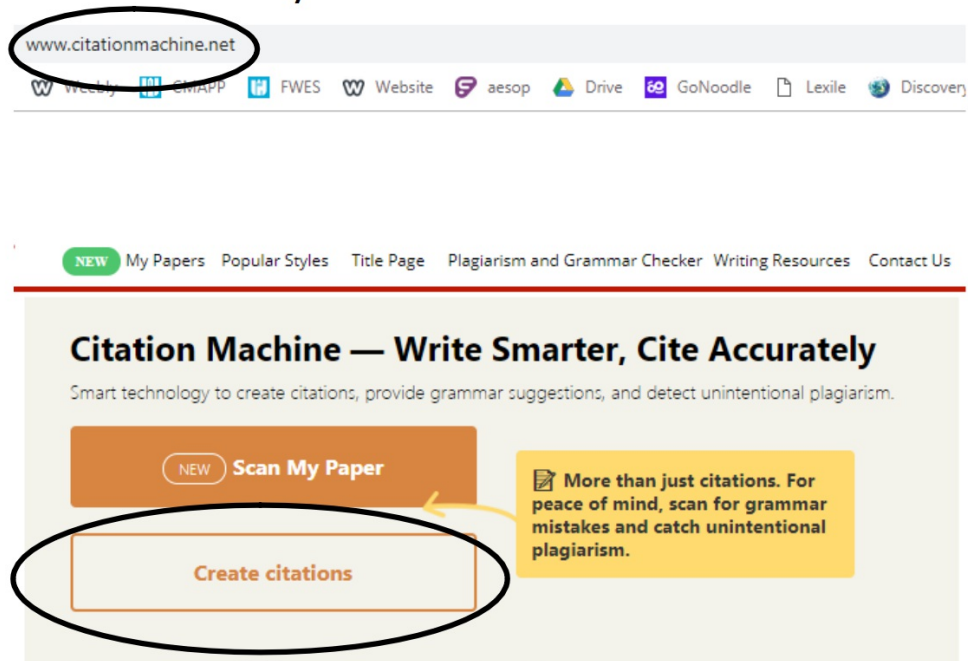
Luckily, we have resources that can help us correctly cite a source!

We'll walk through an example:

1. open two windows on Google Chrome
2. go to easybib.com in one window
3. Google "What kind of flowers are bees attracted to?" in another window
4. find the answer you're looking for and write it in YOUR OWN WORDS (not copying it word for word)
5. copy the URL from the address bar of your online source paste it in the search line on easybib.com.

You will need to make sure you go to the final step of citing the source, and then copy down that cited source both with your answer and your Works Cited paper.

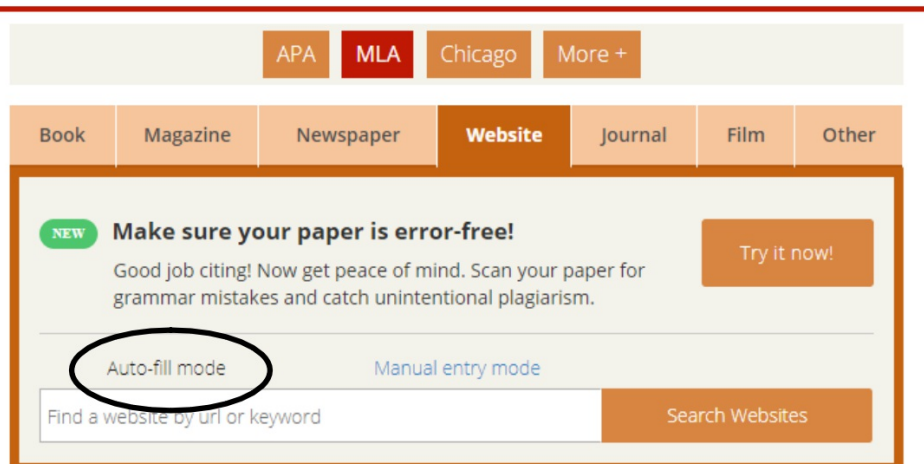
